NAPLAN Information for Parents and Carers

The NAPLAN exams are part of the National Assessment Program developed by ACARA. NAPLAN Tests are set for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 and have been used since 2008.

NAPLAN tests will occur nationally on Tuesday 15th May through to Thursday 17th May with catch up exams running on Friday 18th May for any students who miss the exam due to illness.

NAPLAN is made up of four areas or domains consisting of:

- Reading
- Writing
- Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- Numeracy

NAPLAN tests the skills that are developed in these areas over the years of schooling to show the growth of your child. The data collected from NAPLAN is used by School systems and governments to support and inform good teaching and learning. It gives teachers the opportunity to measure student's abilities across National standards to ensure that all students are challenged at their appropriate level.

Year 10 Retreat

“Who do you say I am?” (Mark 8:29)

The Year 10 Retreat theme for 2018 is “Who do you say I am?” (Mk 8:29), a question Jesus asked his disciples, in order for him to see if they had truly come to understand who He was. Peter responded, “You are the Christ”; echoing Jesus’ burning question to his disciples with a hopes of igniting the start of a deeper understanding of self and their relationship with God. How many times have we been asked this question about not just who Jesus is, but also who we are?




Student Attendance

During Term 2 we will continue to work closely with our students to encourage and maximise their attendance at school.

The target for all students is to attend as much as possible. While we recognise that children fall sick from time to time, and have unavoidable commitments, we strongly encourage parents to maximise the number of days at school.

A couple of days here and there add up very quickly and are very difficult to catch up. We will be meeting with many of our students throughout this term to share with them, on an individual basis, their attendance at school so far this year. In this way we hope to highlight each student's attendance for this year, and for him or her to understand the value of being at school every day.

Student Attendance Categories



The categories of attendance described by the Parramatta Catholic Education office are shown in the attached diagram. The target is to have all students in the green, regular category. We will be working with students and parents, especially where a child is in either the chronic or complex category, to target term 2 for regular attendance: that is, attending every day possible.

If you would like information about or support for attendance issues please contact your child's Learning Advisor in the first instance.


PDSSSC Swimming Carnival

You may/may not be aware 'The Next Generation', a company that believes the way to create energy from waste is to burn it, has proposed to build an incinerator 3kms from our school.

If approved, the incinerator will burn through 552,000 tonnes of waste per year, which could be doubled to over 1 million tonnes per year if all stages are approved. **Students will be breathing in toxic fumes emitted from this facility.** We would like you to join in the fight to stop this facility from being approved. Now the Independent Planning Commission (IPC) NSW is preparing to make its determination and the Commission wants to hear what you think about this project. Naturally, the level of community concern is extremely high and it is important this is reinforced to the IPC by a strong response by you.

The Commission is holding a public meeting at **Rooty Hill RSL**, 55 Sherbrooke Street Rooty Hill NSW 2766, on Monday, **14 May 2018, at 11:00am**. Please attend and show your objection to this company poisoning our students'.



**The need to transform education unquestionable, says
Catholic education leader**

Greg Whitby AM, Executive Director Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta, said today that the significant shift in the model of schools proposed in yesterday's 'Gonski 2.0' report: *Through Growth to Achievement*, should be seen as just the start of what is needed to make education meaningful for millions of young Australians.

"I am delighted that the Federal Government has strongly supported the recommendations in this report," Mr Whitby said. "The dire need to transform education for the wellbeing of future generations and kids at school today is unquestionable.

"It's terrific to see an energetic national discussion about education with a serious focus on learning. This acknowledgement that the world has changed is long overdue.

"Let's hope this leads to a coherent policy framework that supports and funds our education system from end to end. That is the next step. Learning needs to be seen as a continuum. Segmenting funding into early education, primary, secondary and post-school education just doesn't make sense any more."

Mr Whitby said that if we've learnt anything from years of the failed industrial model of education, it's that structural change must be driven by the needs of the learner.

"Educators like to talk about 'teachable moments' - real-world opportunities for lasting learning. I just hope this new report from David Gonski proves to be a teachable moment for our political and education leaders."
